BALLOT QUESTION

Shall the Board of Directors of the Eddyville-Blakesburg Community School District be authorized to levy a tax which will yield \$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation of the district or \$340,000.00 which amount shall then be reduced by the amount of sales tax revenues received pursuant to the levy of sales tax in Mahaska County, Iowa, the balance of which shall then be a combination of sixty percent (60%) physical plant and equipment property tax levy and forty percent (40%) physical plant and equipment income surtax for a period not to exceed five (5) years? In the event the Iowa legislature adopts a one cent sales tax to be used for school infrastructure or other similar purposes which are the same as the physical plant and equipment levy purposes authorized by statute, then this physical plant and equipment levy shall terminate for the period when the first payments of Iowa State sales tax attributable to the legislature enactment of the one cent universal sales tax is received. The income surtax would be no more than eight percent (8%) and the balance shall be raised by property tax.

BALLOT SUMMARY

The Eddyville-Blakesburg Community School District proposes to raise a total of \$340,000.00 per year for five (5) years. \$340,000.00 will be reduced by the amount of sales tax receipts received from the Mahaska County School Sales Tax Levy. The remaining amount after deduction of such Mahaska County sales tax contribution shall be paid by a combination of sixty percent (60%) physical plant and equipment property tax and forty percent (40%) physical plant and equipment income surtax. Annually the Board will establish the rate of income tax and the rate of property tax to be collected. In the event the State of Iowa through the Iowa legislature and general assembly enacts legislation which authorizes a statewide one cent sales tax to be used for the same purposes as the physical plant and equipment levy purposes are used, then this levy shall terminate when the receipts from the one cent sales tax are received. The income surtax will not exceed eight percent (8%) expressed as a full percentage and the balance would be raised by property tax. The Board of Directors will annually determine the exact rate that shall be raised by physical plant and equipment property tax.

Such revenues from the physical plant and equipment levies shall be placed in the physical plant and equipment levy fund and may only be expended for improvements of grounds, for repairing, remodeling, reconstructing, improving or expanding the school houses and buildings, for expenditures of energy conservation, for purchases of transportation equipment for transporting students, for the purchase of student desks and other education and recreation equipment.
