SUMMARY: To authorize imposition of a one percent (1%) local sales and services tax in the County of Monroe, State of Iowa, for school infrastructure projects for ten (10) years, from July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2014.

A local sales and services tax for school infrastructure projects shall be imposed in the County of Monroe, State of Iowa, at the rate of one percent (1%). The tax will begin on July 1, 2004. The tax will be in effect for a period of ten (10) years until June 30, 2014.

The money received from the tax is spent as follows:

Infrastructure purposes and needs of school districts in Monroe County, Iowa including construction, reconstruction, repair, demolition work, purchasing or remodeling of schoolhouses, stadiums, gyms, field houses, and bus garages and the procurement of schoolhouse construction sites, the making of site improvements, and those activities for which revenues under Iowa Code sections 298.3 or 300.2 may be spent. Additionally, "school infrastructure" includes the payment or retirement of outstanding bonds previously issued for school infrastructure purposes and the payment or retirement of new bonds issued for school infrastructure purposes issued under section 422E.4 of the Iowa Code or as may be later statutorily authorized under Iowa law.
